Occurs when a provider bills an amount that exceeds the amount of authorization. This happens when attendance or days of service may not align with the amount invoiced. This may not be identified until after the provider has been paid. Q: How does DEL/DSHS inform providers about what the reason was behind an overpayment, especially when it was long ago? DEL Action: What is being identified and how is it addressed in subsidy billing training and technical assistance provided? (connection to schedule, what exactly needs to be submitted). The updated guide will not include rules that will be in place in December 2017. DEL Action: Coordinate review of letters that goes out to ensure all information is included.

Q: What is the DCYF?

July 16, 2017 Gov. Jay Inslee signed a bill to restructure how the state serves atrisk children and youth by creating the Department of Children, Youth and Families. The governor also appointed Ross Hunter, director of the state's Department of Early Learning, to lead DCYF. The new agency, after a yearlong transition period that begins this month, will oversee several services now offered through the state Department of Social and Health Services and the Department of Early Learning. These include all programs from the Children's Administration in DSHS such as Child Protective Services, the Family Assessment Response program and adoption support, as well as all DEL services, including the Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program for preschoolers and Working Connections Child Care.

Starting in July 2019, the new department also will administer programs offered by the Juvenile Rehabilitation office and the Office of Juvenile Justice in DSHS. Those programs include juvenile rehabilitation institutions, community facilities and parole services.
