As everyone knows we do not have a State Budget at this time. Until that happens we don't know what is going to happen to Early Learning. We are still working to allow Family Child Care to be ECEAP sites. There is still hope this will happen.

I am also sitting on a committee to change the MERIT Trainers process. So far we have made great progress. I am encouraged that DEL is listening and willing to make changes. Stay tuned and as things become official I will let you know.

We are also working on changes to Early Achievers. So far many changes have been made. But be aware that funding is still an issue. If you have concerns about Early Achievers be sure to let me know so that I can pursue these.

I just got word today that Bob Hamilton is retiring this month. He will be greatly missed. I do not know if any one will replace him or who that person will be.

Highlights from the SEIU 925 Contract, July 1, 2013 - July 30, 2015 By Christine Price

- July 1, 2013 No absence days. If a child attends one day during the month you can claim the total authorized days. If they are authorized for 23 days and there are only 20 work days in the month you can only claim 20 days. Remember if you are closed for any of those days you can't claim those either. In July I was closed on July 5th. I cannot claim that day. I can only claim 22 days not 23.
- The field trip/activity fee is now \$30.00 a month.
- We have a 2% subsidy increase on September 1st, 2013 and an additional 2% for those who have enrolled in Early Achievers.
- Case load for Working Connections will stay at 33,000. This is the limit of those families who are available to access state subsidies. They might have to go back to a waiting list.
- SEIU is not sure when the contract will be finished and mailed out to union members.

Northwest Region Readies for Early Achievers

Long awaited, the Northwest Region of our state is finally gearing up for Early Achievers! As of July 1st, 2013, family child care (and center providers) in Snohomish, Skagit, Whatcom, Island and San Juan counties can begin registering for this exciting new program.

The first step is to register for an upcoming orientation in your area. We plan to offer these sessions all around the region, at times that will be convenient to providers, evenings and on Saturdays. At these sessions, you will get a big picture of what Early Achievers is (helpful, and resource rich for you) and what it isn't (required, and scary). Be looking for more information coming soon.

Once you attend an orientation, you will be able to register in MERIT for Early Achievers (after July I). To do this, you will need to have your facility registered in MERIT. We can help you do this! After you register for Early Achievers, you will be assigned a Technical Assistance Specialist who will help guide you through the Early Achievers process. These TA Specialists work for Child Care Aware of Northwest Washington and have extensive knowledge in child care and early learning.

In addition to the technical assistance you will receive once you join Early Achievers, you will also have access to some online and face to face classes, which are offered to you free of charge. The classes will count towards your annual STARS hours.

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Legislative Action was taken to exempt School Aged Drop In Programs from licensing if House Bill 1547:

- Provides recreational or educational programming for school-aged children only.
- Uses a drop-in model, where children are able to attend during any or all program hours without a formal reservation.
- Does not assume responsibility in lieu of the parent, unless for coordinated transportation.
- Is a local affiliate of a national nonprofit.
- Is in compliance with all safety and quality standards set by the national agency.
- House Bill 1547, sponsored by Rep. Maureen Walsh, R-Walla Walla.

At this time the only program that meets these requirements are Boys and Girls Clubs
