SEIU Local 925 News

When the Washington state Family Child Care Association was looking for a union, they choose SEIU for a good reason. They knew that without a strong union, we did not have the power to make important changes in the way childcare providers are treated. I have been active with the union for nearly 10 years. I have seen first hand how the union has given us a voice. We get to sit at the table with the state and bargain a contract that allows providers to have the funds to do quality childcare.

Marie Keller is our Local 925 Chapter President. Marie sent me a quick list of recent achievements. So here they are in her words:

- The Early Start Act of 2015 means that the policies are changing in Early Learning. SEIU 925 members are now serving on committees and are engaged in advocating for policies that work for us. One change is an education requirement. Everyone needs to verify they have a high school diploma or GED to stay licensed by April 2017. SEIU has negotiated ways providers can accomplish this. You can earn an Initial Certificate at any one of the 21 community and technical colleges offering ECE programs. They are available in multiple languages, in cohort groups, and online. Providers can also apply for a scholarship to get an Initial Certificate or GED. You may also rate at a lever 3 or higher in Early Achievers to meet the criteria.
- Enrollment in Early Achievers is now required for anyone who wants to be accept a childcare subsidy. There are deadlines, supports, grants, and guidance and more information is available at CCA of Washington. Deadline for enrollment is August 2016. You must rate at a level 3 by December 2019.
- Substitute Pool: We are now enrolling. We are building a pool of qualified substitutes. Please call 1-877-734-8673 if you are interested in enrolling.
- In April the union will be launching statewide STEM trainings for family childcare providers. Call the Member Resource Center @ 1-877-734-8673 for more information. There will be a flyer coming out showing the next regional meeting in your area, which will be on STEM.
- SEIU 925 has launched a Member Benefits Program exclusive to our members. Discounts are available on curriculum, movie tickets, professional services, liability insurance, etc. Call the member Resource Center @ I-877-734-8673 for more info.
- ECEAP is piloting in family childcare. Do you think you may like to contract with DEL to deliver a high quality preschool program? Expansion is available now in Spokane and Vancouver. We hope to learn a lot about how to make ECEAP work in licensed family homes this year and expand all over the state.
- Early Achievers 2.0: "The Race to the Top" grants and funding is now over. The Early Start Act is continuing to fund tiered reimbursement, quality awards, scholarships and grants for Early Achievers participants. The legislature has required a task force of Early Learning advocates to continue to improve EA to reduce barriers and build participation. It is a continuous work in progress, and we want to hear from you. Please contact Marie Keller @ I-425-210-9057 or hmariefeller@yahoo.com with your thoughts and ideas.
- A Professional Development Institute will support preparing substitutes, and other professionals in the field with relevant trainings to their work.

Infant Care -- SIDS/SUID and Sleeping

Can you identify non-compliance items in these infant sleeping area?



Bouncers are not safe for infants to sleep in or be kept in for long periods of time. Babies are propped at an angle in bouncers, which then poses a tip hazard. If the infant is not strapped in properly, there is also the hazard that he/she could roll out.

Rockers or similar devices as shown in this photo are not safe for infants to sleep in or to stay in for long periods of time. These devices pose a tip or trip hazard, especially when there are older children in care. In addition, if the baby is not strapped in properly he/she could potentially roll over and suffocate.





Babies should never be allowed to sleep on an adult bed or propped up like this photo displays. This baby could easily roll over and be suffocated by the pillow.

This is extremely dangerous.

This baby is sleeping in a basket (container) inside a crib. As illustrated in the photo, there are many potential hazards in the crib which

increase the infant's risk of SIDS/SUID: soft bedding, toys, pillows, and so on. If a baby does fall asleep in a container, he/she must be transferred immediately into safe sleeping environment such as approved crib or playpen.
